We are an independent, non-profit charitable foundation, licensed by the Ministry of Social Affairs and Labor under license number (76/291) issued on 27/12/2009, operating across the Republic of Yemen. We established our main headquarters in the city of Mukalla as the first specialized foundation in the field of cancer control in the Hadhramaut region. We offer a series of programs and projects based on careful studies to meet community needs.

The Foundation works to care for cancer patients, providing them with medical, psychological, social, and financial support throughout all stages of treatment, in addition to a set of awareness projects aimed at reducing the spread of cancer and promoting its early detection. We are further distinguished by operating under an administrative and financial system built on accredited international standards, holding the ISO 9001:2015 international quality certificate, and being a member of the Gulf Federation for Cancer Control.

In our persistent pursuit of comprehensive and integrated treatment, we expanded our scope of support to encompass the curative, humanitarian, social, psychological, and financial aspects for patients.

What fuels our pride and commitment is that cancer patients who receive our free services tell me they see hope in the Foundation.

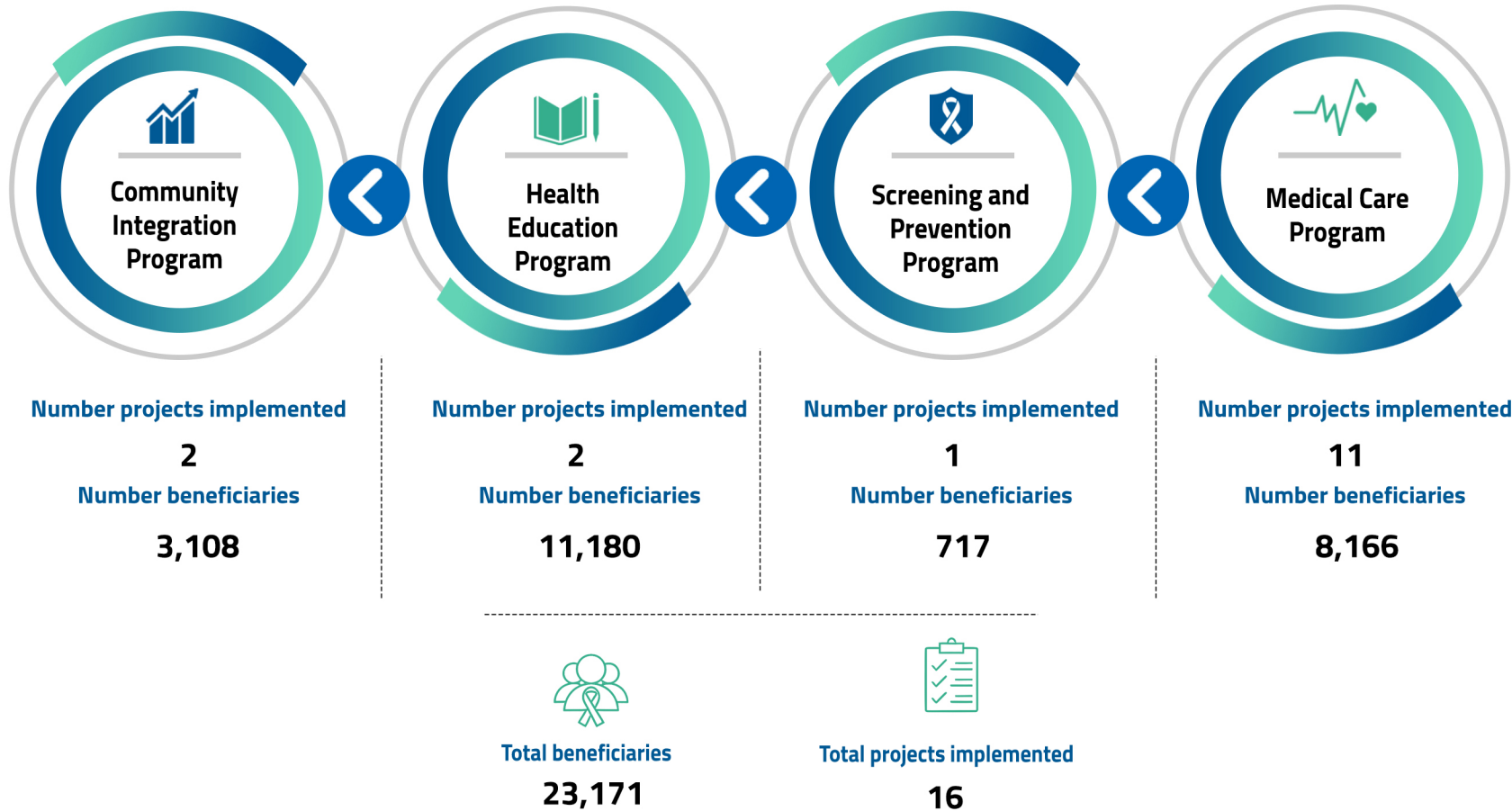
I extend my sincere thanks and gratitude to our loyal partners, whose continuous support and charitable initiatives have helped the Foundation sustain its work and increase its impact.

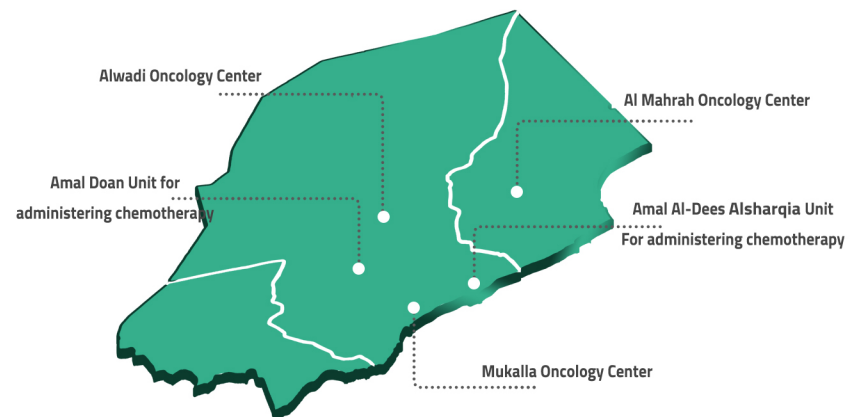
## 1 Amal Units for Chemotherapy (hope Units)

In collaboration with government agencies, the private sector, and civil society organizations, the Hadhramaut Foundation launched the "Hope Units" program. This program aims to provide healthcare for cancer patients by establishing specialized chemotherapy units in underserved areas. Through these partnerships, the Foundation seeks to create a supportive and healthy environment for cancer patients.

Following the success of the "Amal Doan Unit " project in 2020, the Foundation aims, through this program, to facilitate patients' access to necessary treatment and bring healthcare services closer to them in numerous areas, both within and outside Hadhramaut. This will contribute to improving their chances of recovery and alleviating their suffering and that of their families.

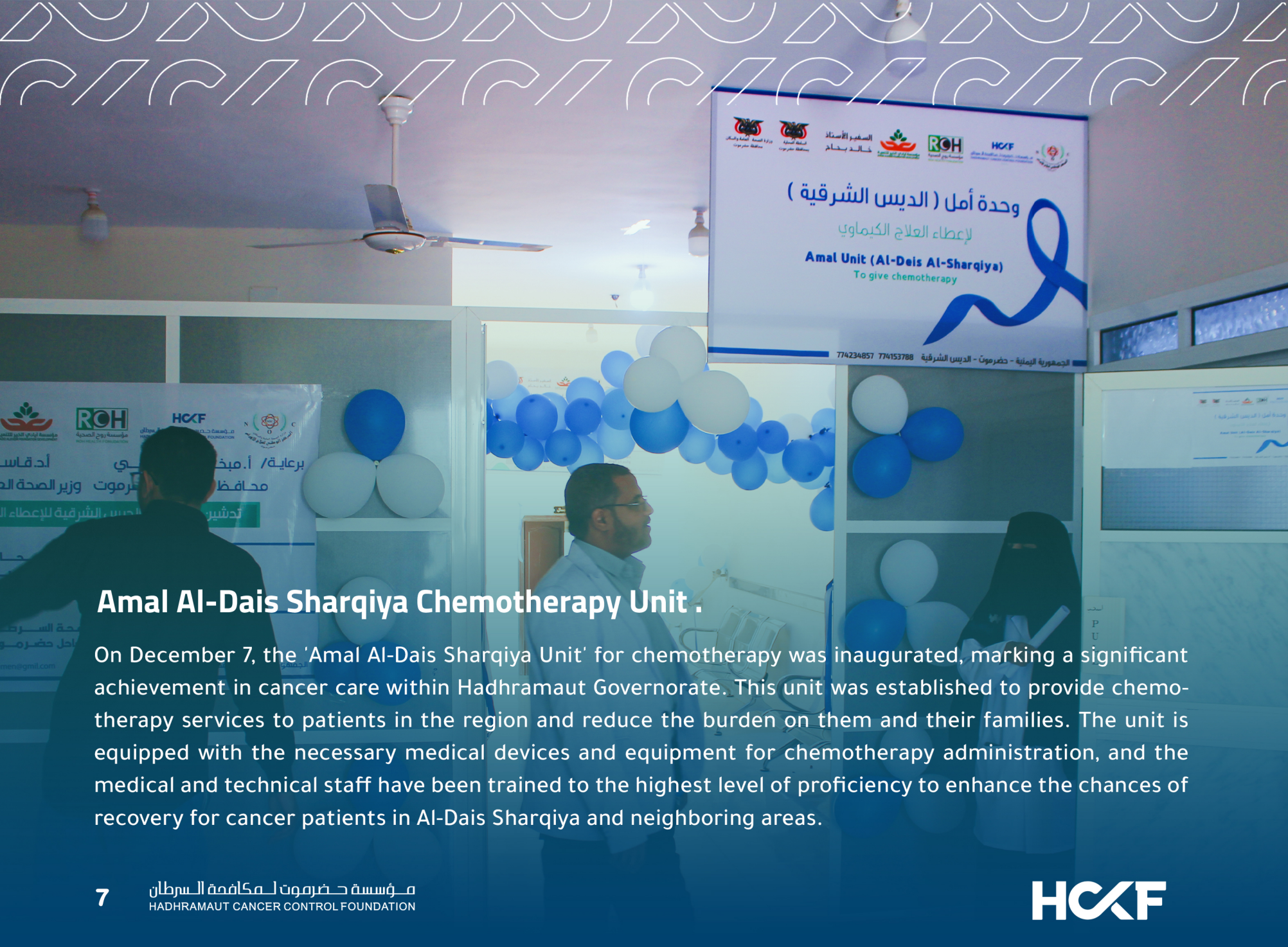


### Locations of directorates and governorates that contain chemotherapy administration units

## Amal Al-Dais Sharqiya Chemotherapy Unit .

On December 7, the 'Amal Al-Dais Sharqiya Unit' for chemotherapy was inaugurated, marking a significant achievement in cancer care within Hadhramaut Governorate. This unit was established to provide chemotherapy services to patients in the region and reduce the burden on them and their families. The unit is equipped with the necessary medical devices and equipment for chemotherapy administration, and the medical and technical staff have been trained to the highest level of proficiency to enhance the chances of recovery for cancer patients in Al-Dais Sharqiya and neighboring areas.

It facilitates procedures, reduces waiting times, and enables timely treatment. The project also promotes community awareness about the importance of surgery and improves the perception of medical professionals as partners in community health.

- Direct coverage of surgical procedures.



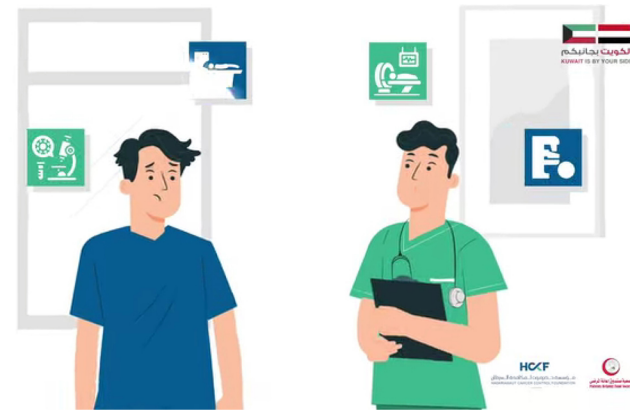

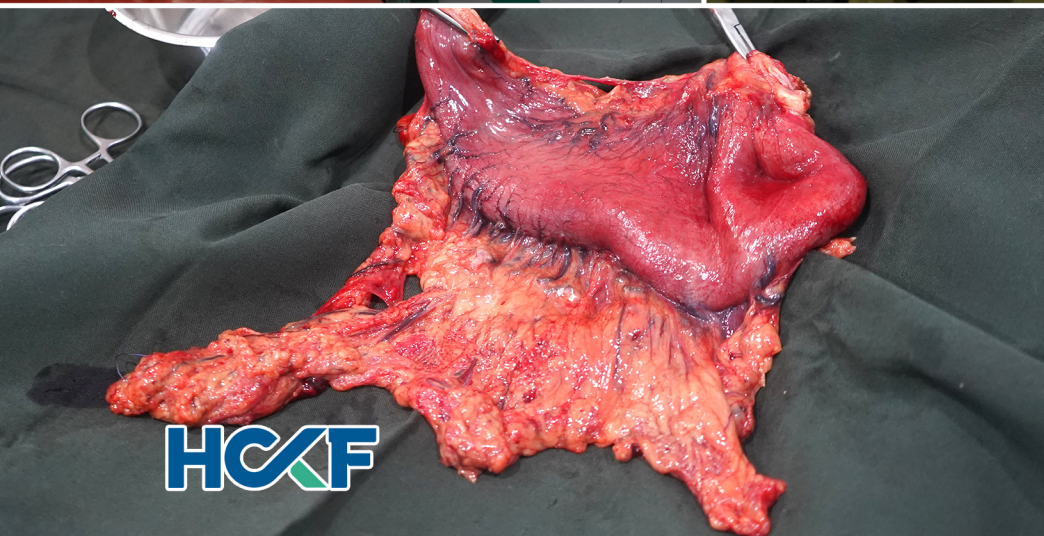

## 4 Diagnostic Imaging Project

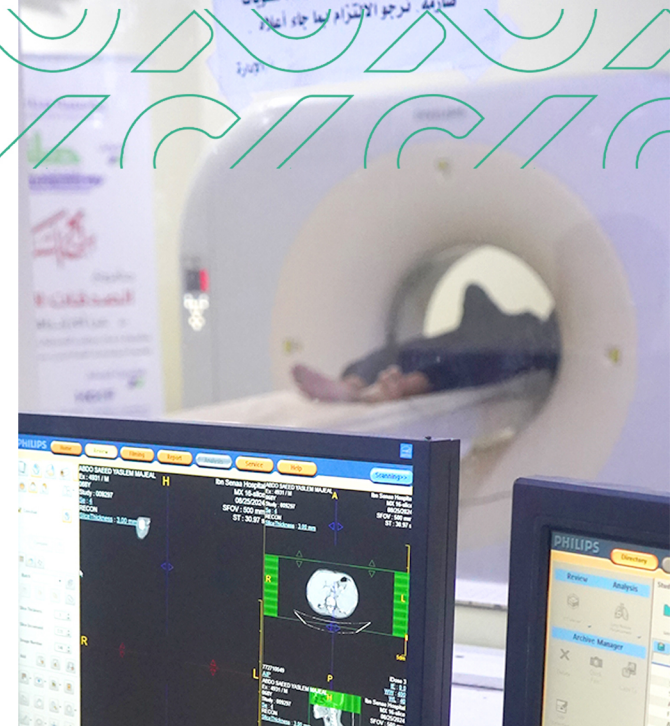
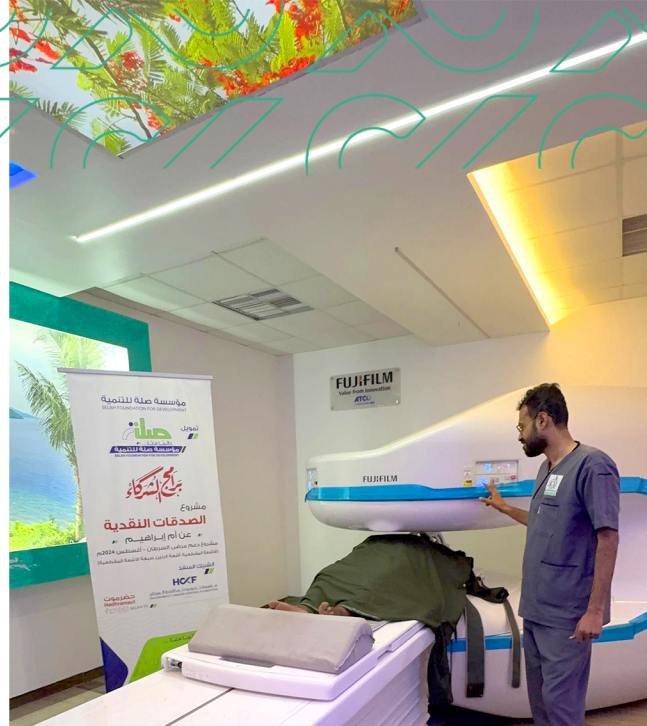

## A Revolution in Medical Diagnosis for Our Community

In a pioneering step towards enhancing healthcare in Hadramawt, and with the generous support of the Arab Fund for Economic and Social Development, the Direct Aid Society, the Ministry of Oil and Minerals, and Al-Amoudi Group for Contracting and Trading Ltd., our organization secured a generous grant that enabled us to acquire mammogram, X-ray, and CT scanners from General Electric, the leading American company in this field. This achievement represents a qualitative leap in our services, as we are now able to offer these examinations free of charge to all cancer patients in the region for the first time.

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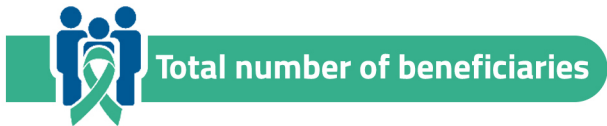


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## 6 Laboratory Tests Program

To achieve an accurate diagnosis of cancer, since the establishment of the institution, we have been committed to supporting all laboratory tests, including sample tests, tumor markers, and tissue tests for patients. We have been able to alleviate their financial burden by providing financial support of up to (50%) of the value of any laboratory test they need. We are keen to ensure that this support is available to our patients throughout the stages of their treatment journey, from the initial diagnosis to the follow-up stage after treatment. This support is provided directly to the patient, making it easier for them to obtain the necessary results to start treatment or to see the doctor in a timely manner.

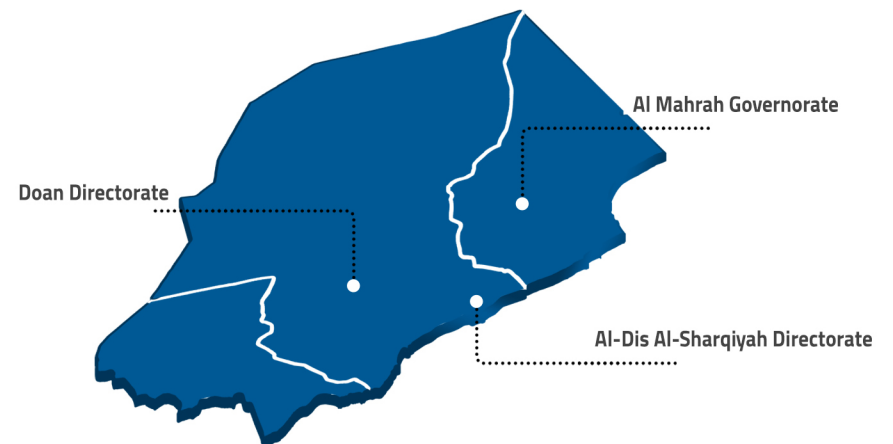

## 7 Nutrition and Supportive Care Program

Our organization recognizes the vital importance of proper nutrition in supporting cancer patients. Therefore, we have launched a comprehensive project that provides albumin and nutritional supplements free of charge.

Albumin is an essential component of supportive care for cancer patients; it is a crucial protein that helps alleviate the side effects of chemotherapy and radiotherapy. It also maintains blood volume and pressure, thereby enhancing the body's ability to fight the disease.

Meanwhile, nutritional supplements play a significant role in boosting immunity and providing the essential nutrients needed for recovery.

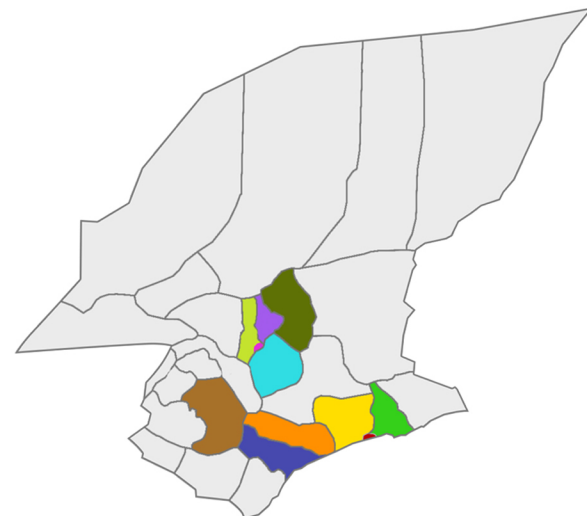
